Please Note: The following Policies and Guidelines will be in effect on Monday August 25, 2008.

Dress Code

*Student uniforms (shirt) must be collared and not exhibit any sort of logo (except the TCDS logo).

*Jackets, sweaters, sweat shirts, etc. shall not exhibit logos, symbols, language or graphic designs that are deemed disruptive to the instructional process.

*Hats, including “hoodies” or other head coverings are not acceptable in any classroom environment. All hats must be worn with the bill facing forward.

Electronic Devices

Cell phones, music and gaming electronic devices may not be operated on campus. Such devices must be turned off upon entering campus. Students found in violation of this policy will have their electronic device confiscated and be immediately sent to the administration office. Such devices will be returned to the student’s parent only. TCDS shall not accept any liability for lost or stolen electronic devices.

Student Tardies

TCDS considers tardiness an academic issue. There are no excused or unexcused tardies. To reinforce the academic expectations of the school the following guidelines are to be implemented:

Students in grades K through 8 are considered tardy if they are not in line with their class at the commencement of their respective “flag” activities. Student tardies are to be reflected in the teacher’s attendance/grade book.

Grades 4 through 8: Tardy students will be “swept” by Debbie Ross and be held until the end of flag activities. Tardy students will be given a late slip which must be presented to their teacher in order to enter the class. Students who enter campus after the sweep must obtain a late slip from the office prior to entering a classroom.

After three (3) tardies a student may be assigned a thirty (30) minute after-school, supervised (Debbie Ross) detention. Ms. Ross will be responsible for notifying parents of their child’s tardies and assignment to detention. Detention activities will have an academic and student responsibility focus. Detention student’s work will be returned to the middle school coordinators.
